"Let us not be weary..." - from one of our Good News Club teams!

It was our first year at this school. We didn't know what to expect, but what we were about to experience was unlike anything we had ever seen before. Our Good News Club was small, with just seven or eight students, including two brothers who could not have been more different.

One brother was very studious. Each week he brought a notebook and pencil so he could draw or write down everything that took place in club. He listened eagerly, and before long he made a profession of faith. It was amazing to watch God work in his heart.

His brother, however, was the complete opposite. He yelled, hid under the tables, ran around, and refused to listen to the teachers. It seemed as if he wanted nothing to do with what was being taught. Many thought he must not have heard anything at all. Some weeks were chaotic but our team was determined not to give up on him.

By the end of the year, we had seen God move in many children's lives. When we returned in the fall, we were shocked to find that this same boy WANTED to come back! His behavior and attitude improved. He listened, he participated, and he encouraged our hearts in a way we never ex- It may have taken nearly seven years, but God's pected.

He continued faithfully in club through elementary school and later moved up to the middle school club. Along the way he made a profession of faith and began attending special church events. This past summer, God worked in his heart in an even greater way. He attended teen

summer camp with our church, followed by Vacation Bible School. At camp, he memorized many Bible verses. At VBS, he stepped out in faith to play an instrument alongside a teen singing group. A few weeks later, he committed to attending church on Sundays.

Since then, he has invited friends to both club and church, and some of them have also made professions of faith. We always knew God could change hearts, but did we really believe He would take that once-disruptive young boy and transform him into a young man faithfully fol**lowing Christ?**

This testimony reminds us of two promises from Scripture:

Galatians 6:9 - "And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not."

Even though most weeks we left weary, we did not give up.


